AP Testing

May is just around the corner which means that it is time to get ready for our Advanced Placement (AP) Exams. AP testing will take place May 4th through the 15th. Stu-

dents enrolled in AP courses have the opportunity to take the corresponding AP exams that schools across the United States will administer during these two weeks. AP exams are an essential part of AP courses providing students with a standardized measure of what they have accomplished in their AP classes.



Most colleges and universities in the United States will grant students college credit for passing scores on AP exams. This will give students the opportunity to be placed in higher courses and get students a head start on their college degree. This year La Quinta has approximately 320 students taking over 600 AP exams. We wish them all luck and congratulate them on participating in the most rigorous academic courses La Quinta has to offer.

Sports Clearance

It is important for those athletes planning on participating in the summer program to make sure you're **cleared** to play. If your student didn't play a fall or spring sport, there is a clearance process, which begins with Diane Smith in the guidance office. Clearance packets can be obtained there and the process includes the following:

- Completing an Acknowledgement of Risk Form (must be done in person)
- Filling out an Emergency Card
- Filling out a Proof of Insurance Form (If you don't have insurance, it can be obtained for a minimal price)
- Having a physical exam (form is in the packet).
- Signing the GGUSD Athletic Code and filling out the Athletic Residency/Transfer Eligibility Form
