### A MESSAGE FROM THE GUIDANCE OFFICE


Congratulations! ... For many of you the stressful time of submitting your college applications, writing those dreaded personal statements, and taking the SAT/ACT has finally come to an end. You have succeeded at taking that first step towards pursuing a higher education. We commend you on all your hard work and dedication but must remind you that it's not over. It is most important now more than ever to pay close attention to all CSU and UC deadlines. Open your email often and submit documents as requested by the DEADLINES. Those of you who are applying to any private colleges/universities must remember to keep track of the important deadlines that you have coming up within the next few months. Many of these colleges will require you to get a letter of recommendation from a teacher and/or counselor. It's important that you give your teachers/coaches/counselors at least two weeks notice.

We would also like to remind you that you must submit official SAT and/or ACT test scores to the colleges that you applied to. Simply log onto **www.collegeboard.com** or **www.act.org** and have your scores sent. Students who applied to multiple Cal State Universities may use code 3594 when submitting your SAT scores. This will send your scores to all of the Cal States. If you have any questions regarding submitting test scores or private applications please feel free to stop by the guidance office.

## Financial Aid

The next step in your college admission process is applying for Financial Aid. ALL Seniors should apply for financial aid regardless of where they will be attending college after their high school graduation. The counselors will be working with both students and parents to assist them through the financial aid process.

A Financial Aid Workshop for your parents is scheduled for WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 27 from 6:30—8:30pm. The workshop will be offered by representatives from the University of California Irvine and Fullerton College. They will help parents understand the financial aid process and review the steps necessary in filling out the FAFSA. The workshop will be presented in English, Vietnamese, and Spanish.

# Do you need \$\$\$ for college?



## Apply for financial aid January 1, 2010 - March 2, 2010.

The counselors will be hosting a Financial Aid Workshop with the students on **Thursday, January 7th** during the school day. During this time we will be reviewing the financial aid process and introducing the students to the FAFSA website.

Students could qualify for:

\* Federal Aid

- Federal Pell Grants
  - Federal Academic Competitive Grants
- Federal Stafford Loans
- Federal Plus Loans

#### \* California Grants

Cal Grant A (tuition and fees at public or private colleges)

Cal Grant B (living expenses, transportation, books & supplies)

Cal Grant C (books & supplies at Community and Technical schools)

## In order to be eligible for any of the financial aid opportunities listed above students must:

- File a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) www.fafsa.ed.gov
   File a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- 2) File a GPA Verification Form Completed individually or submitted electronically by the high school with permission

# TIPS FOR GETTING STARTED EARLY .....

- Turn in your GPA Verification Form with parent signature to Ms. Fitzrandolph ASAP. If you have misplaced the form stop by the guidance office to pick up a new one.
- Apply for a PIN number. The student and one parent will be required to get a pin number in order to electronically sign your FAFSA form. You can do so by accessing **www.pin.ed.gov**
- Gather all the things that you will need to successfully complete the FAFSA form:
  - Social Security Number
  - Driver's License Number
  - 2009 Federal Tax Information or tax return
  - Records of untaxed income, such as Social Security Benefits, Welfare Benefits, and Veterans Benefits

# How to Apply for Scholarships

#### WHAT ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS?

Few scholarships will find their way to you. In the majority of cases you must look for them yourself. While many scholarships are available, their requirements vary greatly. Applying for scholarships takes work. Time has to be devoted to researching different kinds of scholarships. Not all scholarships require strong GPA's. Many scholarships require membership in service organizations or involvement in community and extra-curricular activities. The trick is to find a scholarship that fits you.
